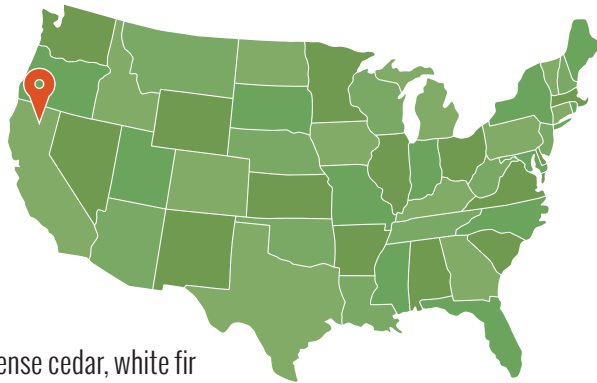

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS:

- February-April 2018 planting timeline
- 400,000 trees
- Douglasfir, ponderosa pine, sugar pine, incense cedar, white fir
- 2,667 acres



Multiple fires over the last five years have taken their toll on Klamath National Forest, leaving large swaths of charred landscape with little to no seed sources for natural regeneration. Affected areas include critical habitat for the northern spotted owl as well as river habitat for threatened and endangered Coho Salmon. Reforestation efforts will shorten the time frame for reestablishing this habitat, providing slope stability, and reducing potential long-term erosion.
